

University of Michigan-Flint Application for Graduate Admission

All applicants to a UM-Flint graduate program must have a U.S. bachelor's degree or equivalent from an accredited institution. Students who have previously been admitted and enrolled in a UM-Flint graduate program and have not been active in the past 12 months must apply for readmission. Applications for readmission can be obtained from the Office of Graduate Programs.

Application Instructions

Complete the attached application and submit it together with the \$55 application fee. The application fee can be paid by credit card (Visa, Mastercard, or Discover) using our Application Fee Payment Form (available at www.umflint.edu/graduateprograms/forms.htm) or by a check or money order drawn on a U.S. bank. We do not accept checks that are drawn on a bank outside of the United States. The application fee is nonrefundable and cannot be credited toward tuition or any other fees.

Special Notes about Completing the Application

- UMID: If you have attended a University of Michigan campus, you may have an 8-digit UMID. Providing this information will help the process of matching your documents to your application.
- **Social Security Number**: Your social security number is optional, but important for helping us match your application with financial aid information, test scores, and any other documents you may have on file. If you do not have a social security number, leave this space blank.
- Name: The name you provide will appear on all official university documents and on visa documents where applicable. Be sure to list your former names and/or variations of your names which may appear on any of your supporting documents.
- · Address: Be sure to notify the Office of Graduate Programs of any changes in your address after completing this application.

If you answered "yes" and any of the following circumstances apply, you must file an Application for Resident Classification and be approved to qualify for in-state tuition:

- You currently live outside the state of Michigan for any purpose, including, but not limited to, education, volunteer activities, military service, travel, employment.
- You have attended or graduated from a college outside the state of Michigan.
- You have been employed or domiciled outside the state of Michigan within the last 3 years.
- You are not a U.S. citizen or Permanent Resident Alien (if you're a Permanent Resident Alien, you must have a Permanent Resident Alien Card).
- Your spouse, partner, or parent is in Michigan as a nonresident student, medical resident, fellow, or for military assignment or other temporary employment.
- You are 24 years of age or younger and a parent lives outside the state of Michigan.
- · You are 24 years of age or younger and have attended or graduated from a high school outside the state of Michigan.
- You have attended or graduated from an out-of-state high school and have been involved in educational pursuits for the majority of time since high school graduation.
- You previously attended any U-M campus (Ann Arbor, Dearborn, or Flint) as a nonresident.

Other circumstances may also require you to file a residency application.

Residency Applications can be obtained from the Residency Classification Office, University of Michigan Office of the Registrar, 1210 LSA Building, 500 S. State St., Ann Arbor, MI 48109-1382, phone (734) 764-1400. The University's Residency Classification Guidelines can be found on the Web at http://ro.umich.edu/resreg.php.

The **deadline dates** for submitting an Application for Resident Classification apply to the term for which residency is sought and are as follows: **September 30 for Fall Term, January 31 for Winter Term, July 31 for Spring, Spring/Summer, and Summer Terms**. Applications must be received in the Residency Classification Office by 5 p.m. on the deadline date. Applicants who do not file by the deadline will be responsible for paying nonresident tuition.

- **Education**: List all post-secondary institutions attended (i.e., undergraduate, graduate, vocational, technical school or college) and degrees received or expected in chronological order. Please attach an additional sheet if you attended more than three institutions.
- Signature and date are mandatory. Sign and date the application after reading the statement.

Supplemental Application Materials

- Some graduate programs have a **supplemental application** which must be submitted in addition to this application to the university. Check www.umflint.edu/graduateprograms and navigate to your intended program of study's admissions page to find out if a supplemental application is required.
- Official transcripts must be submitted from all post-secondary institutions attended. Request the registrar(s) at your previous institution(s) to mail one official copy of your transcript(s) to the Office of Graduate Programs. All transcripts, mark sheets, or official academic records of the applicant's coursework taken outside of the U.S. must include marks or grades for each course of study and be sent in their original language with an official English translation. If you attended the University of Michigan-Flint, we will obtain your transcript for you. If you attended the University of Michigan-Flint and previously submitted official transcripts from other institutions where you had completed college or university coursework, the Office of the Registrar may still have your transcripts on file, and we will attempt to obtain those transcripts on your behalf. If the Office of the Registrar no longer has certain transcripts on file, it will be your responsibility to request official transcripts from the issuing institutions.
- Most programs require a **personal statement or essay** in some form. Check www.umflint.edu/graduateprograms and navigate to your intended program of study's admissions page for guidelines.
- Most programs require **recommendations or references** from people who can evaluate your scholarly and/or clinical ability. Recommendations can be submitted online (for those using the online application only) or by mail using a specific form. Check www.umflint.edu/graduateprograms and navigate to your intended program of study's admissions page for guidelines.
- Some programs require **test scores**, such as the GRE or GMAT.
- Some programs require copies of certifications or licenses.
- Applicants whose native language is not English (this includes U.S. citizens and permanent residents whose native language is not English, even if currently a U.S. citizen or permanent resident and regardless of how long you have resided or been educated in the U.S.) must demonstrate English proficiency by providing evidence through one of the following methods:
 - I.Take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL), the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) exam, the Michigan English Language Assessment Battery (MELAB), or the Examination for the Certificate of Proficiency in English (ECPE). Scores must be no more than two (2) years old. The minimum acceptable scores are as follows:
 - a.TOEFL: 84 on Internet-based test (minimum of 23 in reading, 23 in listening, 17 in speaking, and 21 in writing) or 560 on paper-based test b. MELAB: 80 (minimum of 80 in each section)
 - c. IELTS: 6.5
 - d. ECPE: Certificate of Proficiency
 - 2. Provide an official transcript showing one of the following:
 - a. A degree earned at an accredited U.S. college or university OR
 - b. A degree earned at a foreign institution where the primary language of instruction was English OR
 - c. Successful completion ('C' or higher) of ENG 111 or Eng 112 or equivalent
 - 3. Programs not associated with the Rackham Graduate School: Successfully complete ELS 112 at an ELS Language Center with a minimum score of 80 on the MELICET.
 - 4. Physical Therapy Transitional or Certificate programs: Provide a copy of your FCCPT Comprehensive Credential Evaluation Certificate.
- International students must submit certification of financial resources adequate to provide for all expenses while attending the University of Michigan-Flint. An Affidavit of Support must be completed and returned with either an a) original, currently dated bank statement; or b) an original, currently dated letter with a bank official's signature. The bank statement must show the required available funds as specified on the affidavit. The Affidavit of Financial Support is valid for one year. If the form is not included with your application materials, please contact the Office of Graduate Programs.

Application Deadlines

Please note that most programs have specific deadlines for the submission of application materials. Find your intended program of study below for application deadlines. To be considered for scholarships, grants, and research assistantships, you must apply no later than May I for the Fall semester. International applicants are required to apply no later than four months prior to the term of intended enrollment.
